You Can Be A Philanthropist, Too

The Giving Book is a publication of the Great Falls Area Community Foundation. The hope of the Foundation is that the Giving Book will educate our residents and businesses regarding options for making a charitable gift to area nonprofits, while providing attorneys, accountants, and financial planners with the information they need to guide their clients who wish to make a donation to support our communities.

You and your family have probably been touched in some way by a worthwhile cause that makes our community a better place to live. Non-profit organizations bring so much to our community – in arts and culture, education, affordable housing, medical care, basic human needs, economic development, and natural resources and conservation.

In this time of the coronavirus pandemic, local charities need your support. Their expenses have increased while their donations have gone down as regular donors face the financial impacts of COVID. Your donations can make a huge difference.

We encourage you to say "thank you" for the many gifts you have received while working and living here by giving back to our community. Giving is very important to our community because contributions help us keep our resources local and improve our quality of life. As you make your estate plans, consider making a gift to your favorite charities through your will, a charitable gift annuity, a charitable trust, or a life insurance policy. Not only will your gift give you the satisfaction of knowing that you will be remembered far, far into the future, a donation can also provide financial benefit to the donor.

The CARES Act and Its Impact on Your Charitable Giving In 2020

The CARES COVID Relief Act allows for a \$300 above the line charitable deduction for those who do not itemize their deductions. For those who do itemize, the 60% AGI limitation for cash donations has been lifted allowing donors to deduct qualified contributions of cash, up to 100% of their adjusted gross income with any excess carried over to future years. In addition, for 2020 there is also a deduction limitation increase for businesses, from 10% up to 25% of taxable income for cash gifts.

The required minimum distribution requirements from retirement plans or IRA's do not apply for 2020, but you can still take some or all of these distributions and give transfer them directly from your retirement plan or IRA to charities as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This is a nice option as there is no tax consequence for doing a QCD. This is still a good estate planning tool as well as a great way to do charitable giving without using current cash.

Ways to Be a Philanthropist

DIRECT GIFTS: Many charitable gifts are made to organizations to fund operations or perhaps a capital fund drive. These gifts are always most welcome and needed to provide for current programs and for building construction or improvements.

ENDOWMENTS: Endowments provide the opportunity for contributors to make a most lasting gift, one that builds the ability of an organization to help families and individuals far into the future. There are many ways to make an endowment gift, as shown later in the Giving Book.

BEQUESTS: A bequest is a charitable gift made in your will or in some other document. Language adding a bequest can easily be added to your will. You can also make a charity or an endowment the beneficiary of a life insurance policy, stock certificate, or a bank account as a bequest. You can designate that the bequest be used for on-going operations or to build an endowment.

What is Planned Giving?

Planned giving allows donors to maintain access to income during their lifetimes, provides estate and tax planning tools, and builds permanent wealth for our state's charities, nonprofit organizations and local community foundations. Each individual, family, or organization has unique charitable interests and unique financial circumstances. Planned giving helps make the most of both, so donors receive the greatest return on their community investment.

Planned gifts may produce significant tax savings. They often help a donor avoid or stretch out payment of capital gains taxes, earn federal and state income tax deductions, reduce the size of the donor's estate, and if given to a Montana charity to benefit a qualified endowment, may be eligible for the Montana Endowment Tax Credit.

About the Montana Endowment Tax Credit

Originally enacted in 1997, The Montana Endowment Tax Credit allows donors to pay less in Montana state income taxes when they give make a qualifying planned gift to benefit a qualified Montana charitable endowment. Examples of qualifying planned gifts include charitable gift annuities, deferred gift annuities, charitable trusts and gifts of paid up life insurance. The incentive is 40% of the gift's federal charitable deduction, up to a maximum \$10,000 tax credit, per year, per individual, or \$20,000 per year for couples filing jointly when both have MT tax liability. Additionally, businesses can receive a 20% credit on direct gifts of cash to qualified endowments, up to a maximum of \$10,000 per year.

Gift Instruments - Gift Annuities

CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY: Donors can make a gift of cash or property to a qualified, local charity now, get immediate tax benefits, and ensure that they or a loved one receive fixed quarterly, monthly, biannual, or annual income payments for life. The minimum gift amount to establish a gift in annuity varies by charity.

DEFERRED GIFT ANNUITY: The same instrument as a Charitable Gift Annuity, except that the annuity payments are deferred to sometime in the future. For example, payments may be deferred to provide additional income during retirement years. Deferring payments also has the added advantage of increasing the donor's tax benefits at the time of the gift.

CHARITABLE TRUSTS: Donors can place cash or property in a trust that pays annual income to them (or another named beneficiary or beneficiaries) for life. After their death, the remainder of the trust transfers to their favorite local charities. The donor receives income tax benefits the year they establish the trust.

CHARITABLE REMAINDER UNITRUST: The unitrust pays a fixed percentage of its value, determined each year, to the donor or others they name for life or a term of years. The remaining assets then go to charity.

CHARITABLE REMAINDER ANNUITY TRUST: The trust pays a fixed dollar amount each year to the donor or others they name for life or a term of years. The remaining assets then go to charity.

CHARITABLE LEAD UNITRUST: The unitrust pays a fixed percentage of its value, determined each year, to charity for a term of years or one or more lifetimes. The accumulated assets then go back to the donor or others they name.

CHARITABLE LEAD ANNUITY TRUST: The trust pays a fixed dollar amount each year to charity for a term of years or one or more lifetimes. The accumulated assets then go back to the donor or others they name.

PAID-UP LIFE INSURANCE: The donor transfers ownership of a paid-up life insurance policy to their favorite local charity. Upon the donor's death, the benefit is transferred to the endowment they designate. Donors receive an immediate tax deduction for the cash surrender value of the policy.

Great Falls Area Community Foundation

The Great Falls Area Community Foundation (GFACF) co-hosted Give Great Falls 2020 with the United Way of Cascade County and the Great Falls Area Chamber of Commerce, raising more than \$1000 for the COVID-19 Relief Fund.

The GFACF has been supporting the projects of Leadership Great Falls (LGF) in the past several years so the classes could succeed in their chosen efforts, participants could learn about community foundations and provide new Board members for the Foundation. The LGF class project for 2020 is helping St. Vincent de Paul battle hunger in the local community and **Alliance for Youth** to support the Youth Resource Center, designed to serve homeless and disadvantaged youth. In prior years, GFACF supported Leadership Great Falls work with My Student in Need, Grace Veterans Home, the Dandelion Foundation and Royal Family Kids.

The Great Falls Area Community Foundation provided funding to LGF Class of 2009 for the VISION GREAT FALLS XPO, gathering support, participation and input from existing community programs, leaders, and residents regarding community vision, which they brought together to provide a forum for moving the ideas beyond concepts to actions benefiting our community.

Collaborating with Leadership Great Falls has introduced the concept of community foundations to each class and gathered new Board members for the Foundation.

GFACF awarded grants on a competitive basis to the Children's Museum of Montana, Alliance for Youth, Rural Dynamics, and the Great Falls Children's Receiving Home. Each organization was awarded a grant from the October 2019 open grant cycle.

In 2017, a grant was made to the Upper Missouri River Heritage Area Planning Corporation for matching funds to complete the feasibility study for the Heritage Area, which would promote economic development and tourism in Central Montana.

Other grant recipients have been the Children's Museum of Montana, Great Falls Children's Receiving Home, Great Falls Rescue Mission, My Neighbor in Need, Rural Dynamics/Consumer Credit Counseling, Saint Ann's Soup Kitchen and St. Marten De Porres Mission.
